

Conflict Minerals

The mining of certain raw materials contributes to significant human rights violations and to the financing of violent conflicts in certain regions in the world. The term Conflict Mineral means material comprising or containing tantalum, tin, tungsten and gold (known as 3TG minerals) or their derivatives.

Section 1502 of the Dodd-Frank Wall Street Reform and Consumer Protection Act was passed by the US Congress in 2010 and should contribute to ending these violent conflicts in the Democratic Republic Congo and adjoining countries. Under this law, companies which are subject to the SEC's supervision (Securities and Exchange Commission) must disclose the extent to which products they produce contain Conflict Minerals.

Also, the EU regulation (EU) 2017/821, which came into force on 1 January 2021, requires supply chain due diligence and directly applies to companies that import 3TG metals into the EU, no matter where they originate.

While Sunfab Hydraulics AB is not subject to the SEC's supervision, and does not mine, trade or source minerals directly, it may be indirectly exposed via its supply chain.

Our company is well aware of its social responsibility with regard to the environment, safety, health and human rights, and our activities are based on the established frameworks of the Organization for Economic Cooperation and Development (OECD) and other industry initiatives:

- In support of this policy, Sunfab Hydraulics AB will not acquire any materials that contain minerals that are not conflict-free
- Implement processes to comprehend whether our products contain the minerals mentioned above and is committed to both the traceability of the related goods and the transparency of the supply chain.
- Expect their suppliers (and their suppliers) to exercise due diligence with respect to the source and procurement of Conflict Minerals, which are contained in components and products sold to Sunfab Hydraulics AB, and on request can prove the conflict-free origin of these minerals.
